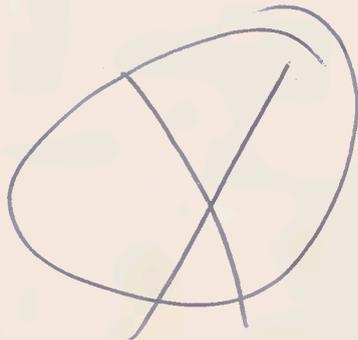

AN ORDINANCE PROMULGATING RULES FOR LOCATION OF
MOBILE HOMES AND TRAILERS WITHIN THE CORPORATE
LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF SUGAR HILL, AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.

SECTION ONE. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor^{or} and Council of the Town of Sugar Hill, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same that from and after the passage of this ordinance no mobile home or trailer shall be placed upon any land located within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill without first having obtained a permit from the City Clerk after hearing before and approval by the Mayor and Council.

SECTION TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that from and after the passage of this ordinance no person shall place a mobile trailer upon any property located within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill without having obtained a permit as provided above, and any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished as provided in the Corporate Charter.

SECTION THREE. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that no municipal utility services shall be connected to any mobile trailer until after approval of the location of said trailer is had by the Mayor and Council as provided herein.

SECTION FOUR. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that no electrical power supplier supplying residential service to the citizens of the Town of Sugar Hill shall connect electrical services to any mobile trailer without first determining if approval of the location of said mobile trailer has been had as provided herein.

SECTION FIVE. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

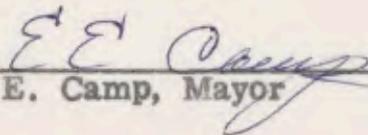

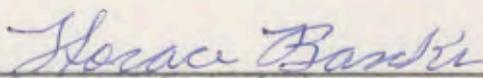

A motion by Sidney Hayes and seconded by Simon Johnson to adopt the attached Ordinance on a Mobile Home Park.

This passed by all Council present.

Mobile home parks which are also known as trailer parks being subject to regulation by the City of Sugar Hill under the general police power of said City, the following ordinance is hereby adopted for the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Sugar Hill.

MOBILE HOME PARKS

ALSO KNOWN AS TRAILER PARKS

ORDINANCE

SECTION I - Definitions

1. Person - Shall mean any natural individual, firm, trust, partnership, association or corporation.
2. Mobile Home or Trailer - Any vehicle, house-car, or any portable or movable vehicle on wheels, skids, rollers or blocks, either self-propelled or by any other means which is designed to be used for residential living, sleeping, commercial or utility purposes.
3. Permanent Mobile Home or Trailer - Any mobile home or trailer from which the wheels have been removed, except for temporary purposes or repair, and which is attached to the ground by means of posts, piers, or a foundation of any type.
4. Mobile Home Park or Trailer Park - Any premises used or intended to be used for the parking of two or more trailers or where two or more trailer spaces are provided.

SECTION II - Permits

1. Any person operating or planning or proposing to operate a mobile home park or trailer park within the City of Sugar Hill shall possess a valid written permit from the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill.
2. Such permit may not be issued until the proposed or existing establishment conforms to the requirements set forth in these regulations. Existing trailer parks or mobile home parks shall be required to secure a permit but shall not be required to comply with the technical requirements of the ordinance except for additions to existing trailer parks or mobile home parks.
3. Applications for permits to construct, maintain, and operate such mobile home park or trailer park shall be made in duplicate upon forms provided by the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill. Such form shall be

completed in all details by the applicant, signed by him in his own name on his own behalf, or as authorized agent for the operator or developer, and the original and one copy shall be filed with the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill. Permits shall be renewed not later than January 1 of each year.

4. Upon receipt of an application to construct, maintain, or operate a mobile home park or trailer park, the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill shall conduct a public hearing on the application. After conducting said public hearing, the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill shall grant or refuse such permits in the exercise of its legal discretion based upon the particular facts relative to the merits of each case. No permit for the uses herein named shall be granted, if in the opinion of the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill such use at the particular location for which the application is filed will either (1) Affect adversely the health or safety of persons residing or working in the neighborhood or (2) be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to property or improvements in such neighborhood or (3) increase traffic problems or congest such territorial area with parking to an extent that same would constitute a hazard to the public safety or (4) materially hinder the establishment or maintenance of a traffic plan regularly adopted for the future development of the area of the City where such proposed use is to be located. Said Mayor and Council may, in their discretion, grant such permit upon terms and conditions which in their opinion are necessary to promote the public health, peace and safety of citizens of the City of Sugar Hill, which condition if specified, must at all times be observed by any person, firm or corporation holding possession or conducting any business by virtue of said permit and upon violation by such person or individual of any such conditions, said permit shall be automatically cancelled.

SECTION III - Mobile Home Parks or Trailer Parks

1. Required Lot Area:

All mobile home parks shall provide space large enough so as to comply with the Public Health Service requirements for sewage disposal.

2. Yard Requirements:

No trailer shall be located within:

- (a) Ten (10) feet of its individual lot line.
- (b) Twenty (20) feet of another such unit side by side, or end to end.
- (c) Fifty (50) feet of the right-of-way line of any public street or way.
- (d) One Hundred Fifty (150) feet of any exterior boundary, excepting any public street or way, of the trailer court.

3. Automobile Parking Requirements:

- (a) Two (2) off-street automobile parking spaces for each mobile home or trailer space shall be provided in a mobile home or trailer park.

- (b) Such off-street parking area shall be situated in a location convenient to the occupants of the mobile homes or trailers and shall have ingress and egress by means of a public way. Such off-street parking area shall be paved.
- (c) Ingress and egress to parking areas adjacent to a public street shall be through driveways or streets, which streets shall be 40-foot streets and shall have a minimum of 28 feet of curing and paving. All streets in said mobile home park or trailer park shall be paved and shall have an adequate base course, 1 1/2 inch binder with 1 inch topping.

4. Recreation Area:

The Mayor and Council shall determine the amount of space in each mobile home park to be designated as a playground and recreation area.

5. Minimum Facilities:

Each trailer park or mobile home park shall provide the following minimum facilities on the site for the common use of all trailer or mobile home occupants:

- (a) Water and Sewage: Each trailer shall be connected with water and sanitary facilities in a manner approved by the Gwinnett County Health Department.
- (b) Fire Protection: Each trailer unit shall be equipped with a fire extinguisher. In addition, each trailer park or mobile home park shall furnish one fire hose cabinet connected with an adequate water supply, together with fire hose and nozzle, for each twenty-five (25) trailer units or fraction thereof.
- (c) Landscaping: Each mobile home park or trailer park shall be landscaped with shade trees and exterior screen planting to provide and assure the reasonable amenities of living and privacy characteristic of more permanent living quarters.

SECTION IV - Plans

Accompanying the application for a permit to operate or construct a mobile home park or trailer park shall be a plot-plan prepared by a registered engineer or surveyor showing the following information:

1. All property lines with dimensions.
2. Adjoining streets with rights-of-way and paving widths.
3. Location of buildings or other structures referenced to the centerline of adjoining streets and to the property lines of the tract.
4. Paved entrances and exits and off-street parking areas.
5. Proposed street right-of-way lines.

6. North arrow for orientation, Land District, and Land Lot, and date of plat.
7. Driveways and walkways, and park and recreation areas.
8. Location of each individual trailer lot.

SECTION V - Conflicting Ordinances Repealed

Any ordinance or portion of ordinances regulating trailers or mobile homes in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI - It shall be unlawful and a violation of this ordinance:

- (a) For the owner of any real estate to allow or permit any trailer to be either parked, located, or occupied on said real estate in violation of any provision of this ordinance.
- (b) For any person to occupy any trailer or mobile home park in violation of the provisions of this ordinance.
- (c) For the owner of any trailer to allow the same to be parked, located, or occupied in violation of any provision of this ordinance.

SECTION VII - Effective Date

This ordinance shall become effective at once and the violation of this ordinance or any part thereof shall constitute disorderly conduct under the ordinances of the City of Sugar Hill, Georgia.

SECTION VIII - Severability Clause

Should any portion of this ordinance be declared void, the remaining portions of said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

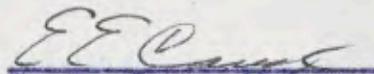

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN OCCUPATION LICENSE TAX

SECTION ONE:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Sugar Hill, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same that from and after the passage of this ordinance each telephone company operating in the City of Sugar Hill shall pay, on or before August 31, of each year, an occupational license tax for that calendar year in the amount of 3% of recurring local service revenues received by such company from subscribers located within the City of Sugar Hill. The annual amount due may be computed by annualizing the recurring local service revenues billed during the month of June preceding the date of payment. The first payment under this Ordinance shall cover the period from its effective date through December 31, of the year in which enacted; shall be 3% of the recurring local service revenues billed during that part of the year; and shall be paid on or before March 15 of the following year. Any amount of license tax previously paid and absorbed by a telephone company, which is applicable to any period subsequent to the effective date of this Ordinance shall be credited against the amounts imposed herein or by subsequent Ordinance.

SECTION TWO:

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that "Recurring local service revenues" shall mean:

- (a) Monthly charges for local exchange service, including:
1. Charges for additional listings and joint users;
 2. The guarantee portion of the charge for semi-public pay station services;

3. Charges for local message rate service, including mobile service local messages; and
4. Subscriber station revenues from teletypewriter exchange service.

(b) Charges for Morse transmission, signaling, data transmission, remote metering and supervisory control, where both terminal points are within the City limits.

(c) All charges for local private line services (except audio and video program transmission services) where both terminals of the private line are within the City limits.

(d) Nothing in this definition shall preclude the charging of a separate franchise fee for the transmission of audio or video programs to customers by CATV Companies.

SECTION THREE:

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

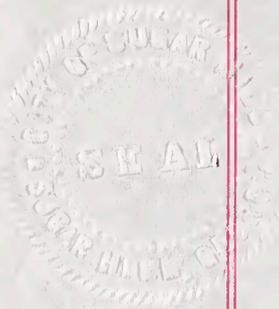

At a regular meeting of the Council for the Town of Sugar Hill, Georgia, held on the 9th day of Dec 1972, with a quorum present and participating, it was unanimously resolved:

That it shall be unlawful for any locomotive engineer or any other member of a train crew, or any person driving, operating or controlling the speed of any engine or locomotive, operated upon a railroad, or upon a track constructed of rails, or controlling the speed of any freight car, passenger car, train or any part thereof, or any switch engine, operated upon such track or rails, to operate the same within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill at a rate of speed greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour.

That it shall be unlawful for any person to operate within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill any freight train, passenger train, engine, locomotive, switch engine, freight car, passenger car or coach, or any part of a train upon any railroad or upon any track equipped with rails, upon, over, or across any crossing of a public street or road within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill at a rate of speed in excess of thirty-five (35) miles per hour.

That it shall be unlawful to move any train, engine or cars over any crossing of a public street or road within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill unless the signaling devices at such intersection, when installed, are operating so as to give warning of the approach thereof or unless a flagman is provided to give warning of such movement; provided, however, that this section shall not apply to through trains on the main line of the Southern Railroad.

That it shall be unlawful for any train, engine, switch engine, freight car, passenger car or coach, or any part of such train, to be backed over, onto, or across a public street or public road crossing (surface crossing) within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill without a member of the crew being stationed upon the rear end thereof for the purpose of keeping a lookout and provided with ample means of giving warning to persons upon such crossing and to the person in immediate control of such operation.

That it shall be unlawful for any member of a train crew or any other agent or employee of a railroad company having control over the stopping, starting, placing or movement of a railway train or trains, railway cars, or railway locomotives to permit any part of a public surface crossing over any railway tracks within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill to become and remain blocked by a train at rest, or by any car or locomotive at rest, for longer than five (5) minutes; provided, however, that at any time there is such a blockage of a public surface crossing within the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill, at least one other public surface crossing within the corporate limits shall be open for vehicular traffic.

That railway trains, parts of trains, cars and locomotives shall not be left standing or in motionless position so near to public crossings as to obscure the vision of persons upon said crossings and prevent such persons from being able to see approaching trains or parts thereof, or locomotives, for a distance of thirty-five (35) yards in either direction of such crossings.

And that it shall be the duty of the police to enforce this ordinance and each section thereof, and to this end, they shall be permitted to go upon railroad properties, board trains, cars, and locomotives, serve summonses and make arrests for any violation of any of the foregoing.

That any violation of any of the foregoing shall constitute a misdemeanor and may be punished as provided by law.

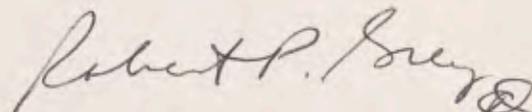

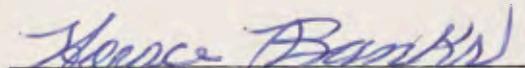

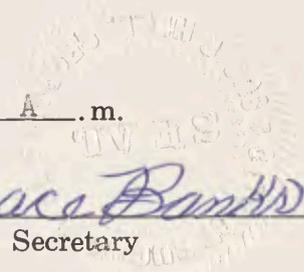

Cash may be placed in escrow with the City in lieu of the maintenance bond.

The developer or owner shall be required to sign a maintenance agreement with the City by which the developer shall agree to maintain the streets, curbs and gutters, and rights of way for a period of twelve months from the date of the agreement. During the developer maintenance period, the City manager, or other designated City agent or employee, shall make inspections and instruct the developer by letter as to what correction must be made.

At the end of the twelve months' developer maintenance period, the City manager, or other designated agent or employee, shall make a final inspection and notify the developer, and the bonding company, if there is one, of any corrections to be made. If the work is acceptable at this time, the bond shall be cancelled, or the escrow fund shall be released.

If the required corrections are not made within 30 days of notice, the City shall have the authority to make the corrections at the expense of the bonding company. In cases where cash has been held in escrow by the City, the cost of making such corrections shall be deducted from the cash and the developer charged with any cost above the amount of escrow funds.

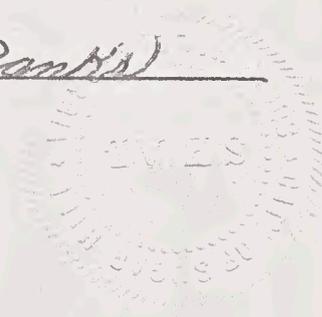

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A POLICE COURT FOR THE TOWN OF
SUGAR HILL, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

SECTION ONE: Pursuant to the provisions of Section 11 of the charter of the Town of Sugar Hill (Georgia Laws 1939, page 1308, et seq.) a police court in and for the Town of Sugar Hill, Georgia, is hereby created.

SECTION TWO: Be it further ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Sugar Hill, that Edwin Whidby shall act as the recorder of the said Police Court for the trial of all violators of the ordinances, by-laws, rules and regulations of said Town, and he is hereby invested with all authority for trial of said violators and shall have the right to inflict punishment not to exceed a fine of \$100.00 on any one violation of the ordinance, by laws, rules and regulations of said Town. In default of the payment of said fine and the costs, said recorder shall have the authority to confine any violator in the common jail of the Town not to exceed sixty days for any one offense.

SECTION THREE: All rights provided for in Section 11 of the charter of the Town of Sugar Hill for the Mayor or Mayor Protem to act as the Judge of the Police Court are hereby delegated to said Recorder.

SECTION FOUR: Said recorder shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Sugar Hill and shall be paid the sum of \$_____ per month.

SECTION FIVE: The Recorder of the Police Court of the Town of Sugar Hill shall have the power to try all violators of the zoning ordinances for the Town of Sugar Hill.

SECTION SIX: All ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.

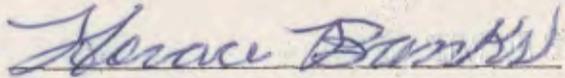

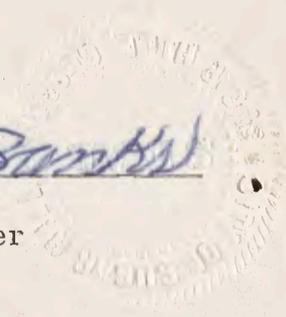

I am corresponding with you as a spokesman for several residents of Forest Green Drive, Sugar Hill, Georgia.

We understand there is a City Ordinance prohibiting accumulating and parking junk automobiles and associated parts in a residential area. Some of our property is adjoining to that belonging to a Mr. Alto Tatum. We understand that Mr. Tatum and the City of Sugar Hill have had dealings in the past concerning this matter. We also understand that this ordinance has not been enforced in the past. We understand that we now have a judge and will soon have a County Police Barracks and the City Ordinances can be enforced. We further understand that warrants are presently being issued for persons having trailers where they should not be according to City Ordinances.

In the past, I have corresponded personally several times with a City Councilman concerning this problem. I believe this matter has been discussed and it was surmised that I was the only resident of my neighborhood who had a problem. It has also been stated that since only one abandoned car adjoined my property, that I did not have a problem. Does the ordinance state that a person can have no more than one abandoned car placed on his premises in a residential community? If not, it does appear that this one automobile adjacent to my property plus other debris adjacent to other peoples property is in direct violation of the ordinance and proper action should be taken.

The residents of Forest Green Drive who are concerned about this matter will sign this letter and show their address. We would greatly appreciate this matter being brought up at the next City Council Meeting to be held on the first Saturday in March, 1974.
