CITY ORDINANCE OF TOWN OF SUGAR HILL, GEORGIA

TAKE NOTICE:

That the mayor and council of the town of Sugar Hill met in call session on Wednesday night, December 22, 1948 for the purpose of passing the following ordinances:

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the mayor and council of the town of Sugar Hill, Georgia and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, the following ordinances to be enacted to wit:

That it shall be a violation of the ordinances and laws of said town, and that punishment as provided by section 2 of the charter of the town shall be invoked as provided therein for any of the following:

1. Driving an automobile or motor propelled vehicle under the influence of intoxicating beverages.
2. Public drunkenness.
3. For disturbing the peace.
4. Wreckless driving of any vehicle.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance be posted as proved by the charter of the town and that the same become effective at once.

CITY ORDINANCE # 7

JAN. 10, 1949

Section 1. Be it ordained by the mayor and the council of the city of Sugar Hill in called session assembly, that from and after the passage of this act that no person or persons shall drive an automobile, truck, bus, or any other vehicle inside or through the city limits of Sugar Hill at a speed greater than or exceeding 30 miles per hour, and, that no person shall drive an automobile, truck, bus, or any other vehicle inside or through a school zone at a speed greater than or exceeding 20 miles per hour. The same shall be punished for violating this ordinance on conviction of said offense as provided by section 2 of the Code of Sugar Hill, Georgia.

Section 2. That from and after the passage of this ordinance that all ordinances in conflict therewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 9

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the mayor and council of the city of Sugar Hill, Georgia in regular session assembly, that from and after the passage of this act that any and all dogs in the city of Sugar Hill must be innoculated and have tag on all such dogs affected by this act. Any dog or dogs found without proper tag will be shot by city police unless owner provides tag at once, or certificate.

Section 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that from and after this date all dogs regardless of whether they have been innoculated or not must be chained, housed, or muzzled for a period of 21 days after March 7, 1949. After which time elapses this section 2 of this ordinance will become ineffecti ve.

Said building to be used for \_\_\_\_\_ and whereas said person agrees to comply fully with city ordinance #10 dated April 19, 1949 governing building and construction in said town of Sugar Hill, Ga. in accordance with sections #16 and #21 of the Code of Sugar Hill, Ga.

Regulations specifications:

1. BASE: brick, concrete block or concrete
2. SILLS: 2" x 8" for porch, 2 - 2" x 8" doubled or 14" x 8" single sound oak or pine
3. SLEEPERS 2" x 6" or 2" x 8"
4. STUDDING: 2" x 4" 2 ft. on center apart
5. RAFTERS: 2 x 4 or better- less than 10 ft. 2" x 6" on all over 10 feet length.
6. SHEATHING: 1" x 4" to 1" x 12"
7. WEATHERBOARD: 1" x 6" to 1" x 10" shiplap or overlapping boards, asbestos siding.
8. BRICK OR CONCRETE block veneer, brick siding put all way to ground only and flush with gable freeze boards.
9. FLUES: brick built standard height only. No flues out windows.
10. CHIMNEYS: stack chimneys, built slightly above ridge of house, end chimneys same.
11. CEILING AND WALLS: sheet rock, oak or pine ceiling, plaster on lathing.
12. FLOORS: hardwood, pine tongue and groove, asphalt tile.
13. ROOF: asphalt shingles, tin, aluminum, cypress shingles or roll roofing.

## City Ordinance number 10

### Section I

The mayor and council of the town of Sugar Hill met in regular session assembly after careful study and controversy passed the following ordinance in compliance with sections #16 and #21 of the code of Sugar Hill and said ordinance shall become effective immediately.

### Section II

Be it ordained that any and all persons before constructing any building, or contractors or construction companies shall before accepting or letting contracts for any building, whatsoever obtain a permit from the City of Sugar Hill, Georgia.

### Section III

Be it further ordained that specifications for building shall be based upon price of home or building to be constructed, type, as to fire hazards, safety, and health of the community, and purpose for which it is to be used.

### Section IV

Be it further ordained that after this date any and all persons, firms, or corporations before building any building for dwelling or business or religious purposes shall furnish the City of Sugar Hill with plans or a general detail of specifications for the building to be erected to be reviewed by the mayor and council to approve.

### Section V

Be it further ordained that inspection fee of not more than \$5.00 must be paid on the issuance of each permit. City building regulations, and specifications will be on uniform scale.

### Section VI

That from and after the passage of this act that any and all ordinances in conflict therewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

CITY ORDINANCE # 13

The mayor and council of the town of Sugar Hill, Gwinnett County Georgia met in regular assembly on December 5, 1949 and passed the following ordinance to wit:

Sec.1. Be it ordained hereby and by these seals, that it shall be a violation against the city for any person or persons, firms or corporations to operate any and all types of one pin ball machines within the city limits of Sugar Hill, Georgia.

Sec.2. Be it further ordained that any person operating such machine or machines upon conviction of same shall be held in violation and shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 or work on the city street not less than 2 days nor more than 30 days all or part of sentence be at discretion of mayor and council.

Sec.3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.


Attached are two prints covering the proposed street lighting system for Sugar Hill, Georgia.

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Sugar Hill, Georgia met in regular session assembly at the Town Hall on Monday, June 1, 1953 at 7:30 P.M. and the following resolution was enacted, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Town of Sugar Hill has no post office with which to render adequate postal service to the residents of the town and surrounding adjoining territory; and

Last Thursday, September 30, you met with Mr. Royston R. Settle, Vice-president of J. H. Hillsman & Company, Inc., original purchasers of your Bonds and Revenue Certificates. You asked Mr. Settle what it should cost to operate and maintain your water system. Please refer to our engineering report and note that our estimate for operations and maintenance is based on your spending not more than \$125.00 per month for total maintenance and operations cost of the system until there are at least 250 paying customers in the system. Please realize the importance of holding your expenses down as the security for the water Revenue Certificates is the net operating income of the system, and further bear in mind that in the ordinance you adopted creating the debt, the town obligates itself to at all times charge rates sufficient to produce enough net revenue to meet interest and principals payments on the certificate issue and to establish the necessary sinking funds as well.

Our report anticipated your having 245 customers connected to the system at this time. This was based on house location indication furnished us by you. Perhaps you will recall the map upon which was indicated the applicants who had signed for water. The 245 includes the customers who were taking water prior to the sale of the securities. The latest reports show you are still lacking about 100 customers. We know you will do everything possible to encourage your citizens to have their houses piped and tie on to the system. We will be glad to assist you in any publicity campaign to aid in this connection.

If by any chance an impression was gathered from our Mr. Greenaway that any money left in the construction fund after completion of construction could be used for any purpose other than being transferred into the sinking fund is in error and we wish to have

More specifically, the city attorney pointed out that Title 34, Section 3001 of the Georgia Code provided in part, "Whenever any contest shall arise over an election of any constable, municipal officer, or other officers not hereinbefore provided for, the same shall be filed with, heard and determined by the ordinary of the county wherein such contest may arise, under the same rules and regulations as to the mode of procedure as prescribed in contests where commission is issued by the Governor".



ORDINANCE NO. \*

WHEREAS, the City of Sugar Hill, is installing a natural gas transmission and distribution system, and whereas, it is necessary to have certain rules and regulations for the operation of this gas system and to insure the safety of persons and property in Sugar Hill; NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council the City of SUGAR HILL as follows;

DEFINITIONS

The following terms used in this Ordinance shall be interpreted to have the following meanings;

1. GAS SYSTEM:

The transmission line to the City of Sugar Hill, and the distribution mains within and adjacent to the City of Sugar Hill, together with all service lines, valves, meters, cocks, regulating equipment and other appurtenances owned by the City of Sugar Hill.

2. SERVICE LINE: LINE FROM THE MAIN TO THE CONSUMER'S INLET.

3. HOUSE PIPING:

THE piping in or around the house or building of the Customer.

4. APPLIANCES

All stoves, heaters, hot water tanks, conversion units and any other devices in which Natural Gas is used.

5. COATED PIPE:

Iron or steel pipe which has been thoroughly cleaned and coated with a coating equal to Bitumastic No. 4.

6. LICENSEE:

Any person, firm or corporation who has been licensed by the City of Sugar Hill to install house piping and appliances.

7. CITY:

The city of Sugar Hill, acting through it's duly elected Mayor and Council.

8. GAS INSPECTOR:

The duly authorized person hired by the City of Sugar Hill to inspect, operate and maintain the Gas System.

9. MAIN

A line, part of the distribution system, that transports gas.

10. CUSTOMERS:

Any person, firm or corporation buying gas from the City System.

11. CUSTOMER'S INLET.

The location of the pipe at the Customer's premises where gas is delivered to the Customer.

SECTION 1.

Par. "A"

The City shall appoint a Gas Inspector who is authorized, empowered and directed to inspect the installation, construction or reconstruction of all house piping, appliances, fittings or any other appliances that will transport or use natural gas and to operate and maintain the Gas System.

Par. "B"

No pipe or appliances installed to use natural gas from the mains of the Sugar Hill Gas System, shall be installed by any person, firm or corporation unless such person, firm or corporation shall be licensed by the City of Sugar Hill to do such work;

Any applicant for a license who is experienced in his type of work, who is familiar with these rules and regulations and who is a reliable and competent



workman , shall be examined by the Gas Inspector . If the Gas Inspector is satisfied that this prospective licensee is capable of doing the work in a first class workmanlike manner, a license shall be issued to such person upon the payment of a fee of \$1.00 by residents and \$5.00 by non-residents. This license will be good for a period of ONE YEAR from date issued. This license will be revoked immediately if any licensee shall violate any provisions of this Ordinance or shall do any work that is not first class.

Par. "C".

The duties of the Gas Inspector shall be, in general, to operate and maintain the Natural Gas System owned by the City in a first class workmanlike condition at all times. He also shall see that all installations and service lines , house pipe and appliances, shall be done in such a manner that the Customer will be served in satisfactory manner with gas and that the safety of any person or property shall not be endangered. He is to perform his duties in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance and to report to the City any violations thereof. All of his actions shall be subject to review by the Mayor and Council and the decision of the Mayor and Council in all matters shall be final.

Among his duties but not necessarily limited to them are the following specific instructions;

1. He shall examine applicants who desire a license to install gas pipe and appliances and to issue such license when applicant is qualified.

2. Every licensee shall test every installation with air either by Mercury Gauge or vacuum gauge in a manner satisfactory to the Gas Inspector. This test shall include all house pipe and appurtenances up to and including the shut-off cock of the appliance. No appliance shall be installed without the licensee notifying the Gas Inspector. The Gas Inspector shall witness such test and, when test is satisfactory, sign a certificate that such test has been made at a certain time for a certain person at a certain location and for a certain number of outlets. Such certificate shall be filed in the City Hall before any gas is turned into this house pipe. The Gas Inspector shall inspect all appliances that are installed and see that they are regulated to give safe and proper service. The Gas Inspector shall specify the size of the meters and regulators that are used in each installation and shall report the date of the installation together with the make and number of the regulator and meter installed.

3. He shall keep accurate records of the size installation of services, the date of such installation, the number , description, location and date of each regulator and meter installed.

4. A fee of \$1.00 shall be charged by the City of Sugar Hill to the licensee, for each house pipe inspection made and certificate issued. In the event the Gas Inspector finds the work done by the licensee unsatisfactory he shall so advise the licensee. The licensee shall then correct any improper work. Another inspection shall then be made for which a fee of \$3.00 will be charged. If the work is not satisfactory, another inspection shall then be made for which a fee of \$5.00 will be charged. If the work ~~is~~ is not satisfactory on the third inspection the license of the licensee shall be revoked and the licensee prohibited from doing any more work under this ordinance.

5. In the event any test indicates a leak, soap-suds at each fitting or connection shall be used to find the leak.

6. No gas shall be turned into a service or house piping until such service or house piping is tested and proved to be gas tight.

7. As gas is turned into a service or house piping the air in the line shall be carefully bled through the appliance burners or through the dead-end of a pipe run. No air shall remain in any part of the piping however small at the time the piping starts serving gas.



SECTION 11

PAR. "A"

All gas appliances hereafter installed shall be of a design and construction approved as to safety by the American Gas Association; except such apparatus as said Association does not accept for test and approval which said apparatus not so accepted must be of a design and construction set forth in specifications of Bureau of Standards of the United States Department of Commerce. Used appliances may be re-installed, when in the opinion of the Gas Inspector they may be used without danger.

Par. "B"

All pipe used for house pipe shall be of good quality wrought iron or steel either black or galvanized, free from all defects. The use of second hand or re-conditioned pipe is forbidden unless tested and approved by the Gas Inspector.

PAR "C"

Fittings used for house piping shall be either black or galvanized all steel or malleable iron. All stops or cocks shall be of ground key type. Where flexible tubing is used it shall be either copper, aluminum or plastic, satisfactory to the Gas Inspector.

SECTION 111

PAR. "A"

No parts of the house pipe that is concealed between walls or other places inaccessible to visual inspection shall have bushings, unions or threads on it. Ground joint unions and standard iron pipe threads and couplings are to be used in joined pipe where such joints are subject to visual inspection. Any pipe laid on the ground or in the ground shall be coated as herein defined. Any pipe encased in concrete shall be coated and further protected by a wrapping of impervious Bitumen impregnated paper. All threads shall be made up with the use of good thread compound.

All house pipe shall be securely fastened to floor joists or sills with pipe straps or other approved devices. The maximum spacing on such devices shall be;

$\frac{1}{2}$ " Pipe-6ft.

$\frac{3}{4}$ " Pipe- 8 ft.

1 " Pipe - 8 ft.

1- $\frac{1}{4}$ " Pipe - And larger pipe. 10 ft.

No notch or hole shall be cut in any timber when or such notch or hole will reduce the strength of timber over 20%.

PAR "B"

All house piping shall be graded to a drip located in an accessible place generally directly downstream of Customer's meter. The drips shall be of a diameter equal to the size piping to which it is attached and at least 6" in length.

PAR "C"

All ells looking down shall be installed at the Customer's inlet at a height from the ground approved by the Gas Inspector. This ell shall be installed in such a manner that the additional swivel of the meter can be connected thereto.

PAR. "D"

No branches shall take-off from a pipe run from the bottom side of the pipe run.

PAR. "E"

ANY outlets installed but with no appliance attached shall be capped.



SECTION IV

PAR. "A"

Meters shall be located at a point satisfactory to the Gas Inspector; particular attention being given to the possibility of damage to the riser of the meter. No meter shall be located in a closed unventilated place. Meters shall be installed in such a manner that they are easily available for reading and servicing.

PAR "B"

Each house service shall have in a place readily available a locking cock on the riser below the regulator. Except in an emergency it shall be unlawful for any one except the Gas Inspector to open or close this cock.

PAR "C"

All appliances, except movable appliances, shall be installed with steel or iron piping together with fittings and unions. Tubing of Copper, aluminum or plastic may be used on small movable appliances provided such tubing is approved by the Gas Inspector and an adequate threaded compression coupling ~~is~~ used for connections.

PAR "D"

A shut-off cock shall be installed in each outlet within 2 " of the floor or wall line, as well as a shut-off cock at the appliance itself.

PAR "E"

All appliances shall be located far enough from the wall to remove any danger of the wall becoming hot enough to ignite. All installations of appliances shall be in accordance with provisions of the National Board of Fire Underwriters. Vents shall be installed in a size and manner recommended by the Manufacturers of the appliance and shall be to the satisfaction of the Gas Inspector.

SECTION V

PAR "A"

The minimum diameter of the pipe from the meter to the largest appliance in the house shall be as follows;

- Less than 6 outlets - 1"
- 6 to 9 outlets - 1-1/4"
- 9 to 12 outlets - 1-1/2"

Above 12 outlets, the Gas Inspector shall determine the size of the inlet line.

The diameter of the pipe next to the appliance shall be one size larger than the inlet connection of the appliance.

The size line used in the house piping shall be as follows; in calculating the size of the pipe the calculation should start at the appliance furthest from the meter and proceed successively from that point to the meter.

SECTION VI

PAR. "A"

Unless different arrangements in specific cases are approved by the Gas Inspector and the City, all service lines shall be furnished and laid by the City. The City shall run a service line up to 100 feet in length and will furnish and install the lockwing cock, regulator and meter without charge. For every foot of service line above 100 feet, the City shall charge the sum of 45 per lineal foot. If approved by the Gas Inspector, the City shall run 200 feet of main to serve any one who will use an average amount of gas and who desires such service. If it requires over 200 feet of main to service an additional customer, the customer shall pay for all excess of main above 200 feet at the rate of 80¢ per lineal foot. No one shall be served with gas unless the City can serve such customer at a profit.

PAR "B"

Each customer shall deposit \$10.00 with the City before a service is installed to the Customer's premises. Such \$10.00 will be refunded the Customer when the service is disconnected provided the Customer does not owe the City anything for Gas used.

PAR "C"

In the event a customer desires to have his service temporarily disconnected, the City will cut off the gas to this customer. A fee of \$ 3.00 will be charged for such shut-off. The City will turn the gas back on, at the Customer's request for a fee of \$ 3.00.


SECTION VII

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than \$ 5.00 nor more than \$ 100.00, and may also be imprisoned in the City Jail or sentenced to hard labor for the City for not more than Two months.

WITNESSETH:

1. Town, for and in consideration of the mutual promises herein and the payment of all materials used in the construction of water facilities to properties of Customers by Town, hereby agrees to construct a water line from the municipal water system of said town to properties of customers, subject to the conditions herein set forth.

2. Town is hereby given a right of way and easement along and through the properties of customers for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and servicing said water line and shall have the right of ingress and egress to said premises for said purposes. Said water line, when constructed, shall become the property of Town, and the said Town shall have full and complete control over said line and the addition of new water subscribers, but any additional water subscriber shall pay his pro rata share of the cost of said line and said pro rata share shall be equally divided between Customers for a period of five years from date of execution hereof. Thereafter, any new subscriber shall pay a tap-on fee to Town, but in no event shall Town add any new subscriber to the detriment of Customer's adequate supply of water.

3. Customers shall pay Town the sum of \$50 for each water meter installed by Town and all rules and requirements of Town's bonding ordinance and regulations of said Town governing said water system shall apply to Customers.

4. Customers hereby agree to pay to Town monthly water rates applicable to residents of the corporate limits of said town plus the sum of \$.50 extra per month, and Town shall have the right of



discontinuing water service to any subscriber who fails to pay the monthly water charges.



AN ORDINANCE DEFINING DRUNKENNESS WITHIN THE TOWN OF SUGAR HILL, AND PROVIDING PUNISHMENT THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Sugar Hill, Georgia, that from and after the passage of this Ordinance it shall not be lawful for any person to be, and appear in an intoxicated condition on any public street or highway, or within the curtilage of any private residence, or at or on any fair grounds, ball grounds, show grounds, park, or at any other place of public gathering or assembly, in the corporate limits of the Town of Sugar Hill, which said drunkenness or intoxication may be caused by the excessive use of intoxicating wines, beers, liquors, or opiates. The words "public street or highway", as used herein, shall be construed to mean any public or private street, road, or private way generally used and traveled by the public or by the community where said street, road or private way is located.

Section 2. Be it further ordained that any person who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished with a fine not to exceed \$100.00, and in default of payment of said fine and the costs, by labor on the streets of said town or public works of said town not to exceed 60 days, or confinement in the common jail of said town not to exceed 60 days.

Section 3. Be it ordained that all ordinances, rules, or regulations now of force in the Town of Sugar Hill, which may be in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Be it further ordained that any person who shall violate the provision of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100.00, or by labor on the streets of said town not to exceed 60 days, or confinement in the common jail of said town not to exceed 60 days, said punishments to be adjudged in the discretion of the mayor or the mayor pro. tem. trying the offender.

Section 4. Be it ordained that all ordinances, rules, or regulations now of force in the Town of Sugar Hill which may be in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.



Section 2. The Mayor and Council of the Town of Sugar Hill have the right to inspect all licenses and to require the exhibition of same. The Mayor and Council may designate some employee of the Town to inspect all licenses. and any person, firm or corporation that shall fail or refuse to exhibit his or its license when requested by such officer to do so shall be guilty of an offence against the Town.

Section , 3 any person , firm or corporation required by this ordinance to pay a license and who conducts any such business with out obtaining a license and paying the fee required shall upon upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \$5.00 or more than \$100.00 or be confined in the calaboose not less than five or or more than 30 days or work on the streets and alleys of said city for not more than 30 days. either or all of said penalties in the discretion of the Mayor and in addition the clerk shall an execution for the amount of said license against the defaulters, and said execution shall be levied as a tax execution for

the amount of the license or specific tax and costs.

Section 4. The license taxes fixed by section one of the ordinance are for the intire year unless otherwise provided for in said Section and the yearly license tax set out therein is due and payable in advance. The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective J<sub>a</sub>nuary 1, 1961. License shall be paid in advance annually on Jan, 1, of each year. all License past due Jan. 15th. with penalty.

Section 5. in the event any portion of this ordinance shall be held by the courts, to be invalid and the remaining portions of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Dear Paul:

Relative to our conversation this morning regarding electric homes versus gas, the solution to this matter is talking to people prior to the construction of their homes. I do not believe the matter of the dollar rebate (\$180 electric rebate) is really a deciding factor with most people when you consider how much more it costs them to operate on electric than on gas. The nature of people, however, is that they would sooner have \$ 180 now and pay this much more every year for the next twenty.

I would recommend a program, however, to combat the trend of new houses going to electricity in your area. Since a house lost to gas is approximately \$ 800 loss in net revenue to the City over the life of its Bonds, the City can afford to spend some money to obtain this customer. The following is a program that I would recommend you institute immediately:

1. A direct rebate program to the new home builder (or owner) to provide a cash incentive for the installation of gas. I would suggest \$ 50 for central heating, \$ 25 for each of water heater, cooking range or clothes drier, and \$ 10 for each of any smaller appliances such as small space heater, incinerator, etc., with a total not to exceed \$ 150. This program, when pointed out to the new home owner that it will save him in excess of \$ 2,000 in in fuel costs over the life of his mortgage, as well as give him this financial assistance in purchasing his appliances, should reverse the trend toward all electric houses.

2. Coupled with No. 1 above should be a rebate program on the same amounts of money or possibly smaller amounts for the conversion from a different fuel to natural gas for any existing home owner. (Replace electric water heater with gas, \$ 25, etc.).


